## Scholarship Winners (2019)

We have 10 endowed scholarships at UNB, three endowed scholarships at STU, one scholarship each at the NB Community College and the NB College of Crafts and Design.

In each newsletter, starting usually in the fall, these scholarship winners are highlighted. These are the last scholarship winners highlighted from our 2019 group of winners.



Beatrice Devlin was awarded the CFUW Fredericton 4 year Renewable Scholarship. This is her 3<sup>rd</sup> year to receive it. Beatrice is from Fredericton and graduated from Fredericton High School. She is in her 3<sup>rd</sup> year Bachelor of Arts program. She was on the Dean's List at UNB from 2017 to 2019. E. Sandra Byers, Ph.D., L. Psych. is Professor and Chair in the Department of Psychology at University of New Brunswick in Fredericton and a Research Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada. She

is the author or co-author of more than 190 journal articles and book chapters mostly on aspects of human sexuality as well as an author of a popular undergraduate textbook on human sexuality. She is a past-president of the International Academy of Sex Research and the Canadian Sex Research Forum, a fellow of the Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality and the Canadian Psychological Association, and on the editorial boards of a number of scholarly journals. She has won numerous awards including the: Muriel McQueen Fergusson Foundation Award for outstanding achievements that have further advanced the elimination of family violence in 2001; Donald O. Hebb Award for Distinguished Contribution to Psychology as a Profession from the Canadian Psychological Association in 2010; Kinsey Award for outstanding contributions to the field of sex research, sex therapy, or sexology from the Society for the Scientific Study of Sexuality in 2013; and, Outstanding Contribution Award from the Canadian Sex Research Forum in 2018. She is also a Licenced Clinical Psychologist with a part-time private practice primarily aimed at helping people with their sexual concerns.
