CLIMAtlantic is Atlantic Canada's climate services hub facilitating the effective use of climate data and information for regional adaptation and resilience strategies through collaboration, networking, and partnerships. We are user-driven, focusing on the needs of Indigenous communities, academia, provincial governments, municipalities, local service districts, non-profits, industry, and land-owners. CLIMAtlantic works with all regional and local groups to ensure there is a strong network of collaboration, and data and tools are easily accessible. UPEI Student Panel - Graduate Students in Environment Studies





Graduate Students showcasing their research work on the environment. Leading the panel will be a recent CFUW scholarship recipient, Genevieve Keefe. Genevieve joined the UPEI Climate Smart Lab as a Master's Student in January 2022. After returning to Prince Edward Island from the UK, she worked in R&D at Biovectra (Charlottetown) as an analytical research scientist. Her current project involves the assessment of coastal erosion vulnerabilities on Prince Edward Island and the investigation of appropriate protection measures. Tracy Cutcliffe - L'nuey







Established in 2019, L'nuey is an initiative that focuses on the advancement, implementation, and protection of the constitutionally entrenched rights of the Epekwitnewaq Mi'kmaq (Mi'kmaq of PEI). L'nuey means 'Belonging to or pertaining to the Mi'kmaq People as a whole', and its tagline doubles as its mission: 'Moving towards a better tomorrow'. On January 19, 2022, the Government of Canada and the Epekwitk Assembly of Councils marked the successful conclusion of the feasibility assessment for a national park reserve in the Pituamkek (Hog Island – Sandhills) area with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding which begins negotiations towards a formal national park reserve agreement. The establishment of a protected area will support and conserve the ecological integrity of the area and the wildlife that calls it home, as well as Mi'kmaq cultural sites, and important archaeological sites for future generations.

Tracy Cutcliffe is the Senior Negotiator at L'nuey. She holds a Bachelor of Laws (LLB) from the Schulich Law School – Dalhousie University, and a Bachelor of Business Admin (BBA) from Cape Breton University.

Emma Norton - Climate Emergency Unit





The Climate Emergency Unit, a project of the David Suzuki Institute, works with all sectors to find solutions to the climate crisis. It seeks to move governments and leaders in Canada into true climate emergency mode, pressing them to adopt ambitious policies that align with what science says we must do.

Emma Norton is the Director of Government Relations and Atlantic Canada Organizing for the Climate Emergency Unit. She has a BA (Honours) from the University of Kings College in Environment, Sustainability, and Society and International Development. Emma Norton describes herself as "advocating for emergency level policy responses to the intersecting climate and housing crises." She is "motivated by social justice and climate change, I am a hard-working, passionate, and driven individual. I strive for a low-carbon energy system in Atlantic Canada, where energy is affordable for all."

Jane Farquharson - CFUW; NSCAR





Jane Farquharson is a member of CFUW Charlottetown and the Council of Canadians who has recently led the work with a network of community organizations, local government and concerned residents to form the *North Shore Climate Adaptation and Resilience* group. The group was accepted as one of two Atlantic Canada communities to engage with the Tamarack Institute as member of the 2023 Cohort under the Community Climate Transitions Initiative that is a collective impact movement aimed at supporting a just and equitable climate transition, aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals. The presentation will focus on the approach, anticipated outcomes and considerations in developing grass roots advocacy groups addressing the climate emergency in rural communities. Jane has a MSc in Health Promotion from Dalhousie.



- Annually provide scholarships and bursaries to female students attending the University of New Brunswick, St. Thomas University, New Brunswick Community College, New Brunswick College of Craft and Design
 - o Have endowed 13 scholarships at the University of New Brunswick
 - o Have endowed 3 scholarships at St. Thomas University
 - Have a scholarship at the New Brunswick College of Craft and Design awarded annually to an aboriginal female student
 - Have a scholarship at the New Brunswick Community College awarded annually
- Annually provide 3 monetary prizes to participants in the Fredericton Music Festival.
- ♣ Annually provide 4 monetary grants to rural schools located in the greater Fredericton for their Library or Creative Arts Programs.
- Financially support the Enterprise Program (a program which affords the opportunity for students who are unable to regularly attend high schools in Fredericton and Oromocto to complete their high school program).

In Memoriam

We are very sad to lose a very long time CFUW member: Doreen Kissick. Doreen



was devoted CFUW members for many years and she had assisted CFUW in numerous ways. The family of Doreen Kissick announces her passing at Hospice House on Wednesday, March 8, 2023, surrounded by her family. Born in Toronto, ON, on October 26, 1927, she was the wife of the late Norman L. Kissick. Doreen leaves behind her daughters, Barbara Kissick of Charlottetown, PE, and Maureen Kissick of Sackville, NB. She also leaves behind her granddaughter, Shuanglian Kissick. In addition to her husband, Norman, Doreen was predeceased by her parents, Sidney and Florence (Hicks) Rogers; daughter, Kathleen Kissick; brothers, Gordon and Jack "John" Rogers;

sister, Joan Lloyd. She was the last surviving member of her immediate family. Doreen worked at UNB as an International Student Advisor until her retirement in 1982. She was generous with her time and was a member of several organizations, many dedicated to helping refugees, especially women. Doreen was a Life Member of the New Brunswick Multicultural Association, the National and International Council of Women as well as a member of the Girl Guides of Canada, IODE and CFUW. Doreen was also very active in her church. She was a 30 year member of the Woolastook Presbytery, campus ministry life member and participated on an interchurch refugee committee. A memorial service will be held at Forest Hill United Church on Wednesday, March 22, 2023 at 2 pm with Rev. Ian Manson officiating.
