of evidence to interpret the relationships between different



April General Meeting




CFUW Fredericton has supported the UNB Menstrual Health Society with a small grant. Members tracked down a pool of resources — 15 menstrual product dispensers to be installed in campus buildings and sanitary products from the UNB Health Center. They amassed a group of 54 volunteers to manage the donations, culminating in the establishment of the UNB Menstrual Health Society. The discussion after the presentation was great. Many of the CFUW Fredericton members were not very aware of

"menstrual poverty" and how far reaching that can be for young girls and women even in our community. This meeting was very attended, mostly members, but also a few non-members.

Two members from the organization "Days for Girls" attended the meeting with the UNB Menstrual Health Society. Days for Girls is a non-profit organization that helps girls stay in school and retain dignity during their period, by providing sustainable, reusable and high quality feminine hygiene products to girls worldwide. 


