The Greener Village Foodbank serves over 1,900 client families monthly. They customise roughly 10% of grocery boxes, if possible. More than 1 in 3 of clients are children/youth and 1 in 10 seniors. They also provide a Learning Kitchen, training workshops and partnerships with over 35 community organizations located in the Fredericton area.

Annual Webinar

Our annual Webinar is scheduled for April 10. The Webinar speaker is Dr. Suzanne Dupuis-Blanchard. Dr. Suzanne Dupuis-Blanchard is a full professor at the School of Nursing of the Faculty of Health Sciences and Community Services at the University of Moncton. She holds the Health Research Chair in Aging Populations and is director of the Center for the Study of Aging. She is the immediate past president of the National Seniors Council, advisory body to the federal government (2017-2022) and was president of the Canadian Association on Gerontology (2014-2018).



Dr. Dupuis-Blanchard started out as a community health nurse in the city of Ottawa and is now a research professor. Her research program focuses on multiple aspects of home care for older adults, including interventions to support aging in place through the development of the Nursing Home Without Walls.



Did You know?

WAGF GAP

Pay inequity contributes to the **wage gap** and unfairly reduces women's options. According to Statistics Canada, NB women earned 91,6 cents per dollar earned by men for each hour they worked in 2019: Average hourly rate for MEN: \$28.56 Average hourly rate for WOMEN: \$26.22

Living Wage

A living wage for Fredericton is \$23.45 per hour; Saint John \$21.60 p/h and Moncton \$20.85 p/h.

The New Brunswick minimum wage will go up by \$0.55 on April 1 to \$15.30 p/hr. Most minimum age workers are women.
